

We receive new members in one of the following ways: Letter of Transfer (can be requested by our church office), Reaffirmation of Faith, or Profession of Faith and Baptism.
- 3. Join us during the 10:00am worship service the following Sunday (first Sunday of the month) when we recognize our new members during the service.
- 4. We encourage all new members to participate in an Inquirer's Class, which is offered periodically during the year.
